Hi everyone, this is our last newsletter of the year!
What a year it has been !!

We held our annual graduation ceremony on the 7th of December and it was awesome to see another 24 outstanding students graduate from our programme post their Year 13 at School. The graduates included our first students from Rosehill College so that was a special moment for all.



It is at this time of the year that we reflect on the successes of our programme from last year and I am happy to say that our students excelled in all measures that we use to judge our outcomes. A summary of those successes are as follows:

- 90% of TRF Students achieved passes in Levels 1, 2 and 3 of NCEA, versus a whole of school average pass rate across our five secondary schools of 65%
- Attendance levels of TRF students were between 1% and 19% better than the average attendance of others
- A breakdown of current employment of our 30 graduates from our 2015 year is - 9 at University, 8 at other Tertiary Institutions, 10 in full time employment, 2 overseas and 1 unable to work due to family immigration issues.
- Our students were surveyed and results show that **91%** have gained **confidence** because of being part of TRF, **77%** have gained **leadership skills** because of being part of TRF, **94%** have gained **self respect** because of being part of TRF, **87%** have gained **determination** because of being part of TRF and **89%** have gained **purpose** because of being part of TRF.

The facts above are fully audited by our external auditors and truly reflect the amazing work being done by the TRF team and students on the programme. **We wish you all a fantastic family Christmas and a magical and successful New Year.**

Our relationship with KiwiHarvest

One of our four Pillars is **Synergy** – the idea that, by collaborating with others, we all become greater than we ever could be on our own. We have been so impressed by the generous and efficient way that **KiwiHarvest** functions and by partnering with them we have opened a door of blessing for our students and their families.

We have had our first delivery of rescued food items and we were impressed by the range and quality of the food delivered. From that one delivery we were able to make up **22 care packages** for some of our needy families and had lots of fruit left over for our students too!

To think that, without the efforts of **KiwiHarvest**, all that good food would have gone to waste. Many thanks to **Terry Marsters** for delivering the food to us and to **Julie Crocker** for being such a great co-ordinator and liaison – nothing is too much trouble for these guys and they are a real pleasure to deal with. I'm also excited about the deeper themes beneath the work of **KiwiHarvest** – food politics and their willingness to nibble at the edges of some of the injustices related to food in society.

In my experience Kiwis are naturally generous and honest people, it's not in our nature to deliberately deprive or cheat others. But I think sometimes we don't realise how much need is out there, hidden in our communities. Or we don't think that our extra stuff might really help a struggling family – or we just don't know any good ways to turn our excess into a help for others.

On the other side it's hard for us to accept the charity of others – there's a staunch pride in our own independence which can derail the efforts of those who genuinely care and can isolate us from the compassionate community that wants to share and wants to give.

New Zealand needs more groups like **KiwiHarvest**, selfless and subtly courageous. Willing to see a need and negotiate with big business to find a way to meet it. With the commitment and conviction to do what's necessary to pass on the basics of life to the people in humble circumstances who need them most and are the most deserving, but are generally the least likely to ask for them.

Because we know our families and they know us, we can pass on this blessing where perhaps others might not be able to without causing embarrassment. We are proud to partner with **KiwiHarvest** and we are looking forward to passing the blessing of free food on to the families and communities we serve.

Transition Camp - PAUANUI

A little slice of paradise

The Rising Foundation's first ever stand-alone Year 8 Term 4 transition camp kicked off in the heart of Pauanui. The transition camp involved two of our feeder schools - Pukekohe Intermediate and Pukekohe North with Year 8 students who will be attending Pukekohe High school next year.

The purpose of this camp is to introduce our Year 8's to The Rising Foundation's core values, familiarise the students with our Embassy (classroom) at school, and gain positive relationships with TRF Pukekohe High. Our objective for this camp was to introduce TRF's core values and pillars, give students motivation to explore new environments and discover attributes that help unlock the hidden potential they have.

25 Year 8 students from Pukekohe North and Pukekohe Intermediate joined us for a four-day camp held at Pauanui Glade Holiday Park. We started off at Red Alert Paint Ball where the students split up into two groups, Team Telescopes and Team Blessings. Our theme for this camp was "Builders". The concept of this theme was to teach our students that leadership is constantly under construction - there is always an opportunity to develop as a leader.

Pauanui served us with great weather as we entered into The Amazing Race: Pauanui Edition. TRF Pukekohe High students stepped up to the challenge of leading their respective groups and focusing on the Year 8's journey on camp. The quotes below overall wrap up an amazing camp for all.

And thanks to their connections and support, **Asaeli** now has a contract with **Upright Access** and starts work in the New Year.

We want to thank and honour **Amanda Wheeler** and **Andrea Daly** for their patience and flexibility in bringing us on board. It has taken a while to work out how our two organisations can interface but it is just that willingness to take the time and be flexible that sets **Skills** apart from other Industry Training Organisations.

We have had the privilege of linking with **Skills** at the ground floor of a new pilot programme and **Asaeli** is the first of our students to go through the programme and land a job as a result!

Here's a summary of the programme from **Skills**:

"**SET** stands for Skills, Employment and Training – and the **SET for Life** programme bridges the gap between education and employment in creating a holistic and personalised plan that supports a learners' successful journey into sustainable

employment and further training.

SET for Life aims to provide:

Cross sector connectivity and collaboration, effective pastoral care and support for learners, increased support and workforce capability for employers and transitional support for learners when entering the world of work.

The programme also includes assessment and support in the development of foundation skills of all learners in the project and increased qualification completion rates for learners through collaborating with existing organisations, current projects and services, whanau, education providers and local industry.

We are confident that **SET for life** and our partnership with **Skills** will continue to be a great benefit to our students.
